## **How can I support my community in Norfolk?**

**The Norfolk 100** is for you if you would like to support grassroots causes in your community.

The Norfolk 100 asks you to make an annual donation to Norfolk Community Foundation of £1,000, for a minimum of three years:

£500 to be used immediately to support local needs.

£500 to be invested in the permanent endowment with the income to be used to make grants to Norfolk people forever.

## **All the money given by donors will go directly to good causes in Norfolk.**

The Gift Aid reclaimed (approx £280 for standard rate tax payers) will be used to support the Foundation's grant making and development role, so the Foundation's costs are supported by the tax man.

If you are a higher rate tax payer you will be able to reclaim a further 18% of the value of your gift back via your annual tax return.

Therefore a gift of £1,000 will only cost you £770 per year or £15 per week.

## Gift Aid Notes.

1. As your declaration covers donations you may make in the future:
  - Please notify Norfolk Community Foundation if you change your name or address while the declaration is still in force.
  - You can cancel the declaration at any time by notifying Norfolk Community Foundation. The declaration will not then apply to donations you make on or after the date of cancellation or any later date that you specify.
2. You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that Norfolk Community Foundation reclaims on your donation in the tax year (currently 28p for each £1 you give).
3. If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that Norfolk Community Foundation reclaims, you can cancel your declaration (see note 1).
4. If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self Assessment tax return.
