The Norfolk Superhero Challenge Community Panel has awarded £158,000 to 25 projects in Norfolk, kicking off 3 years of community funding through the Norfolk Superhero Challenge Fund!

Organisation	Project Area	Description
1st Rural Roughton Mill Scout Group	North Norfolk	To fund equipment for a new Explorer Unit offering adventure and opportunities for young people aged 14-18.
31st Norwich Rainbows	Mile Cross, Norwich	To enable their young members aged 4-7 years to take part in a dance session, soft-play experience and a number of outdoor activities at Hautbois Activity Centre.
BikeActive, Norfolk	Long Stratton	To purchase an accessible e-assist bike.
Caring Together Charity	Norfolk	Towards an outdoor adventurous residential weekend for up to 18 young carers in Norfolk.
EP Youth	Fakenham	Towards running holiday activities in the October, February and May half terms of the 2025-26 academic year.
Field of Joy	Reepham	To provide 55 nature-based activity days and retreats for 150 young people outside of mainstream education.
Great Yarmouth & Gorleston Young Carers Project	Great Yarmouth and Gorleston	To deliver a regular programme of sporting and outdoor activities for 250 young carers.
Holt Youth Project	North Norfolk	To train two existing youth practitioners in a Level 2 gym instructors course, to reopen The Health Hut and offer regular gym sessions for young people.
Horstead Centre	Norwich & Surrounding Area	To run two expedition weeks for 30 young people in Norfolk and the Peak District.
Involve Razem Community Interest Company	Thetford	To deliver a 20-week programme of sport and movement workshops for children aged 5-15 for families in Thetford.
Little Miracles	West Norfolk	To set up West Norfolk Try Outs, a 20-session activity programme for young people with disabilities, life-limiting conditions and their siblings





Mancroft Advice Project (MAP)	Great Yarmouth	To continue delivering a weekly open-access sports-based youth group to 50 young people aged 13-18.
Nancy Oldfield Trust	Norfolk	To contribute towards a Bursary scheme to enable children with Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs and Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) to access water-based activities.
Nelson's Journey	Norfolk	Towards an adventurous therapeutic weekend for up to 40 bereaved children and young people in Norfolk.
New Routes Integration	Norwich	To deliver a programme of outdoor and physical activities for children and young people in Norwich who face barriers to participation, including financial hardship, care experience, and SEND.
Norfolk Hoopstars Basketball C.I.C	Norwich & Surrounding Area	To cover the cost of 25 young people attending weekly sessions during 2025/26.
Pandora Project	Kings Lynn	To take 35 children aged 8 to 14 who have been affected by domestic abuse on Bushcraft & Adventure Camps.
Sprowston Youth Engagement Project	Old Catton & Sprowston, Norwich	To provide weekly football training sessions to 80 young people across three age groups.
Stalham Town Football Club	Stalham	To support the development of new and existing youth teams with the purchase of suitable and accessible kit and equipment.
Sunbeams Play	Great Yarmouth	To buy equipment to provide outdoor exercise opportunities for at least 70 autistic children and young people.
SWAN Youth Project (Norfolk)	Downham Market	To fund the weekly sport sessions for their younger members aged 8-11, for 48 weeks.
The Aylsham Community Trust (TACT) Families	Aylsham	To deliver a health and fitness programme to 10 young carers, young people in care, and young people with SEND.
The Norfolk Boat	North Norfolk	Towards bursaries for young people in Norfolk to participate in sail training experiences.
The Snug Norwich CIC	Norwich	To deliver 20 yoga, movement and mindfulness sessions for young people aged 5-16 with SEND and mental health challenges in Norwich.
Toy Like Me	Norfolk	To fund five physical activity events for deaf children and children of deaf adults, as part of The Little Bear Club.
